Do You Have Good News?

While the corporate media peddles in, and even thrives upon bad news, the fact remains that most people are genuinely interested in good news. Certainly, different people have varying ideas of what constitutes good news (i.e. sports teams, store sales, political elections, etc.). However, some things are always seen as good news, such as births, good health reports, and job promotions.

Generally speaking, good news is a very hard thing to keep to oneself. We enjoy sharing our blessings with others, and more times than not, people are kindly receptive to our news.

What is the worst news that you have ever received? Regardless of what first popped into your mind, I submit to you that the worse news any person has ever received (whether

they believe it or not) is that they have sinned, those sins have separated them from God, and should they die in that condition, they will be eternally lost in punishment (Romans 3:23; Isaiah 59:1-2; Revelation 21:8). Those who believe such news might respond with “...*what shall we do?*” (Acts 2:37).

Here's the Good News - God desires that all come to repentance and be saved (II Peter 3:9; I Timothy 2:3-4). God demonstrated His love for us in sending His only Son, Jesus Christ, to die for our sins (Romans 5:6-8; John 3:16-17). Jesus died on the cruel cross of Calvary, was buried, and arose from the dead on the third day (I Corinthians 15:1-4). As a result of God's gift and Jesus' sacrifice, we no longer have to be condemned (Romans 8:1-2), but can put away the body of sin in obedience to His divine will (Romans 6:3-6), and have our sins remitted or washed away (Acts 2:38; 22:16).

This Good News is too liberating and valuable to keep to ourselves! Our friends, neighbors, and relatives need to hear that even though they may be lost, God wants them to be saved. We also must remind one another of this fact often, that we may remain faithful to the One who called us out of darkness and into His marvelous light (I Peter 2:9)!


Family News
